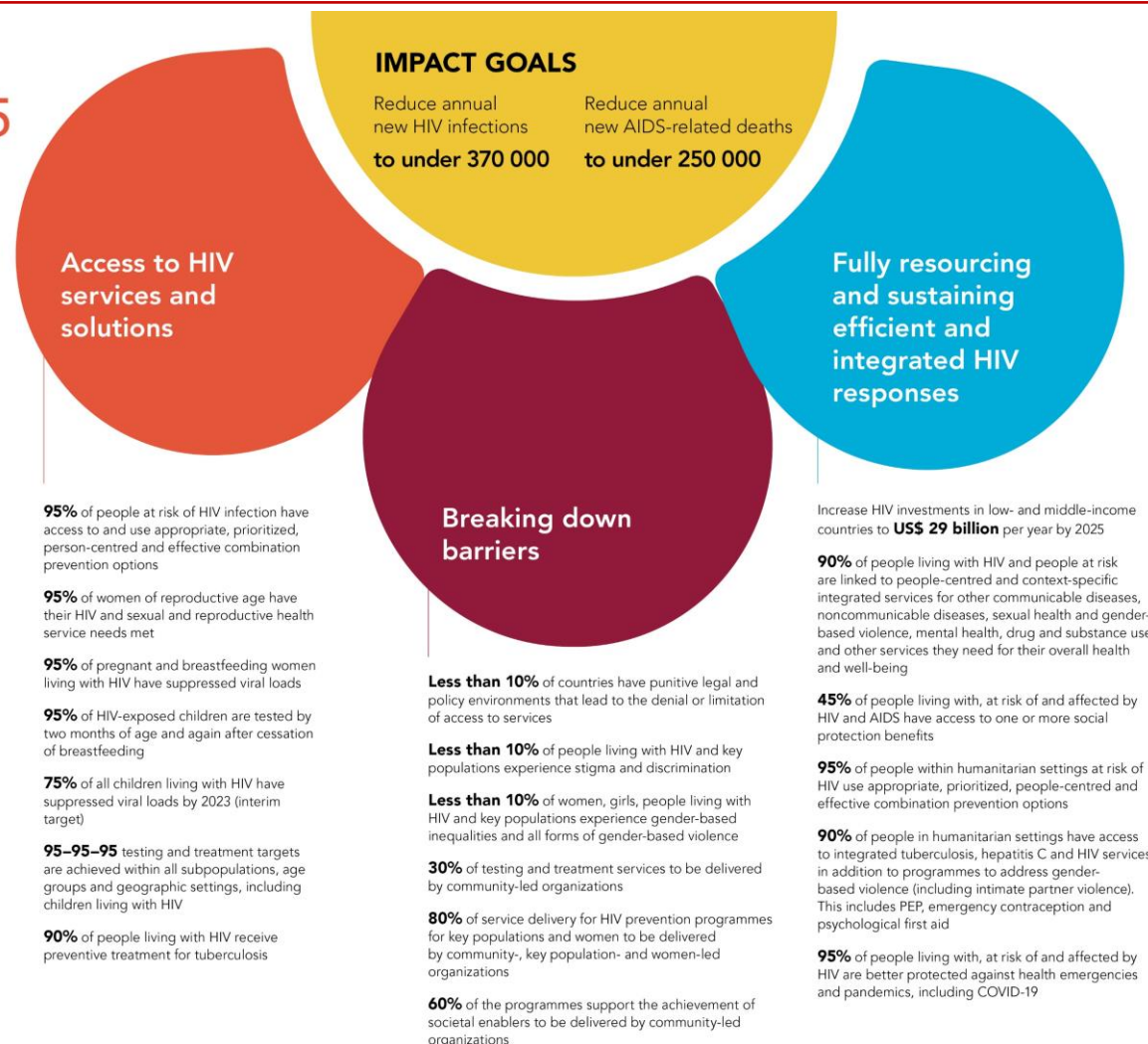

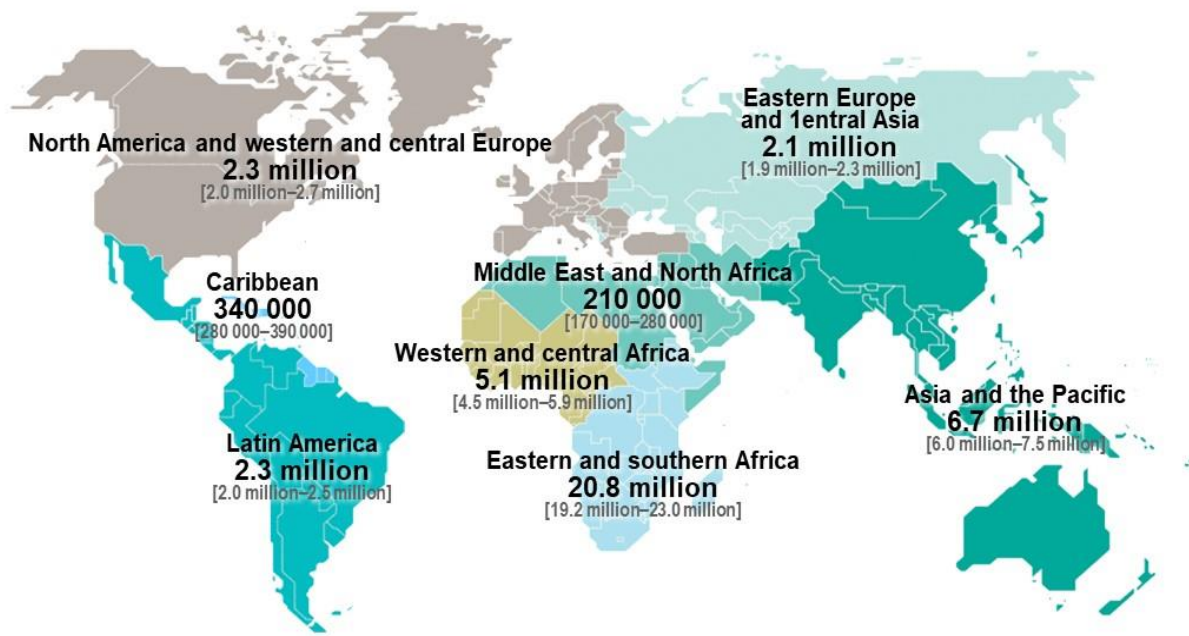

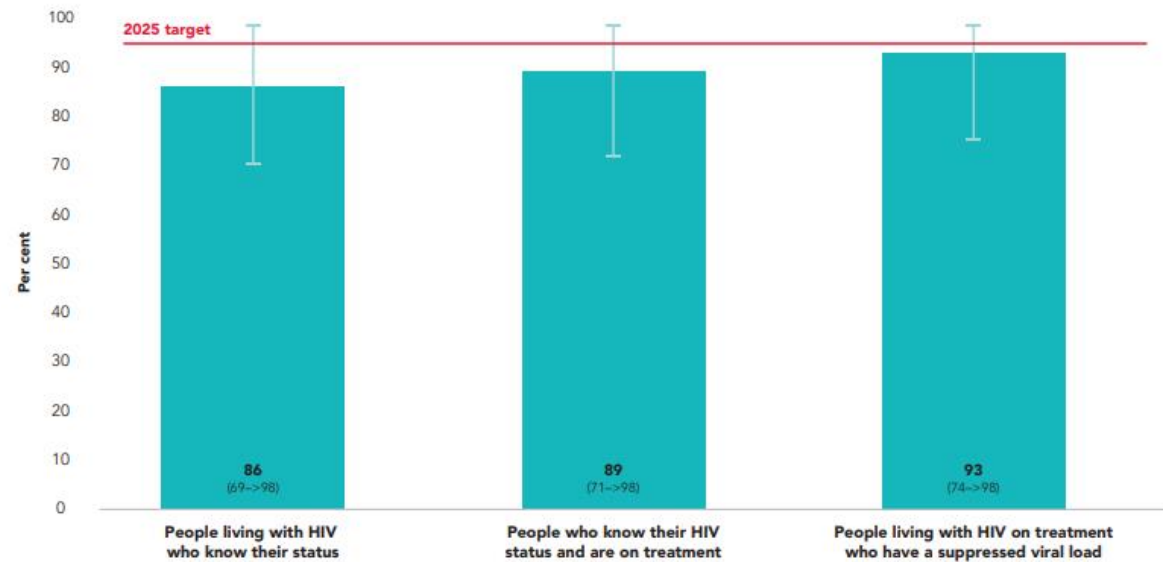


Estimated number of people living with HIV in 2023



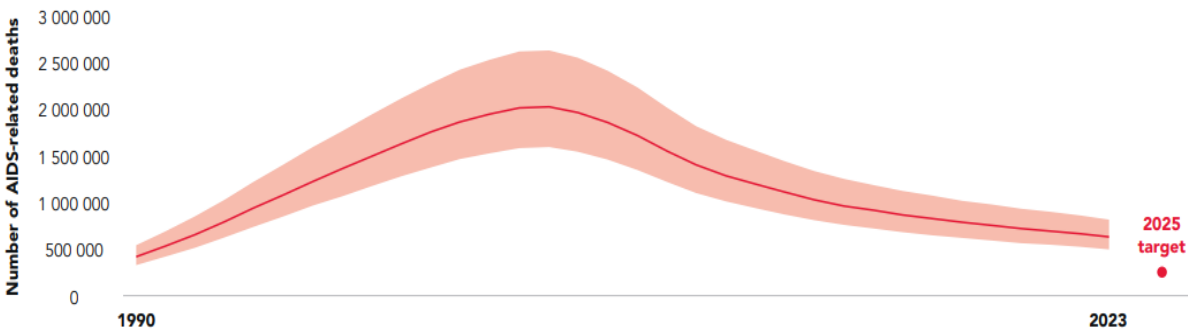

Number of AIDS related deaths, global, 1990-2023, and 2025 targets



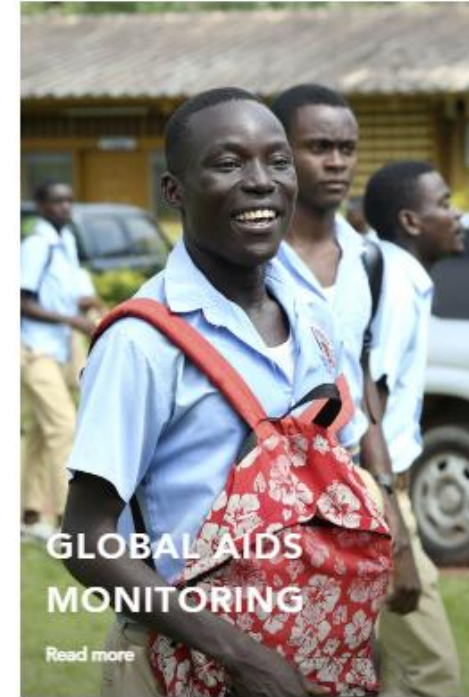
