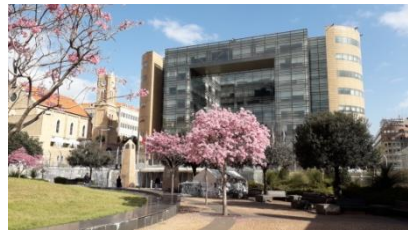

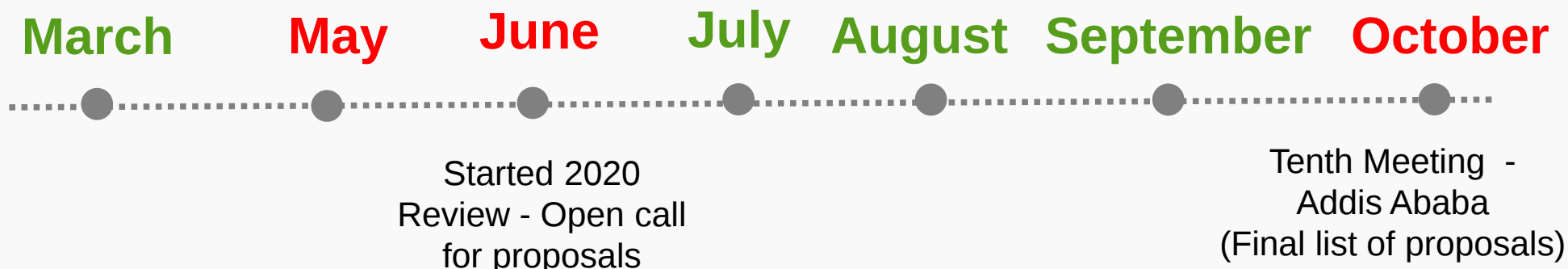

What Mechanisms Were Applied in Latin American Countries?

- ☐ Virtual meeting held on May 6th of 2019 between Brazil and Colombia to start the joint work process within the scope of the IAEG-SDGs.
- ☐ Other virtual meetings between Brazil and Colombia.
- ☐ Definition of focal points in represented countries (Email sent in May 07th of 2019).
- ☐ Protocol to articulate actions with Latin American countries.

- ❑ Virtual meetings with represented countries (22th May and 16th October in 2019).
- ❑ Continued communication by emails (focal points in countries and ECLAC SDG Indicators Team).
- ❑ Elaboration of the additional indicators proposals (June 2019): Brazil and Colombia with support from UN Environment and ECLAC.

Proposals for additional indicators from Brazil and Colombia

3.7. By 2030, ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health services, including family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programs

✓ **Maternity in adolescents: Percentage of adolescent women aged 15-19 who are mothers.**

4.3. By 2030, ensure equal access for all men and women to quality technical, vocational and higher education, including university education.

✓ **Gross enrollment ratio in tertiary education, by sex**

12.5. By 2030, substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse

✓ **Proportion of recycled waste in relation to total collected waste**

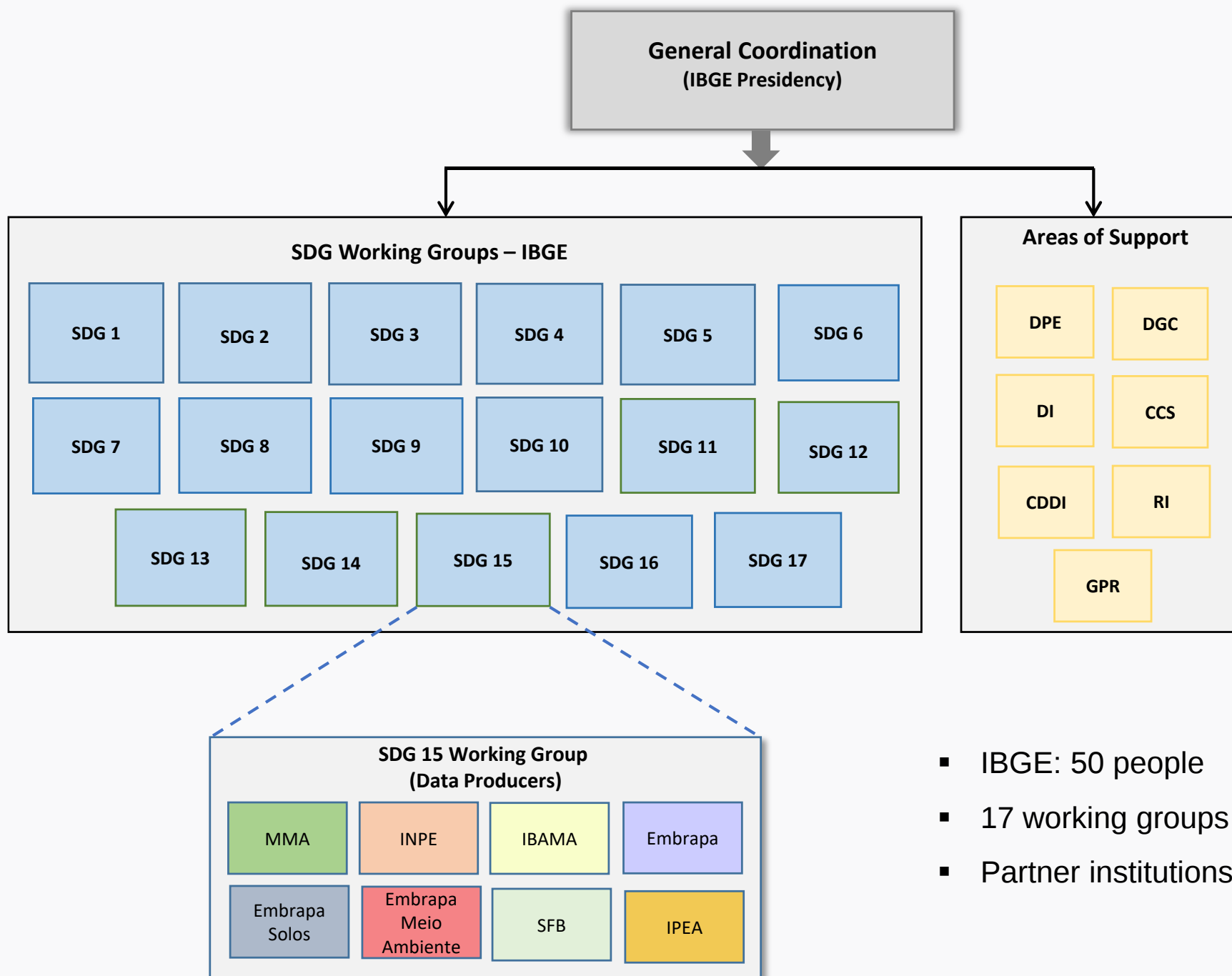

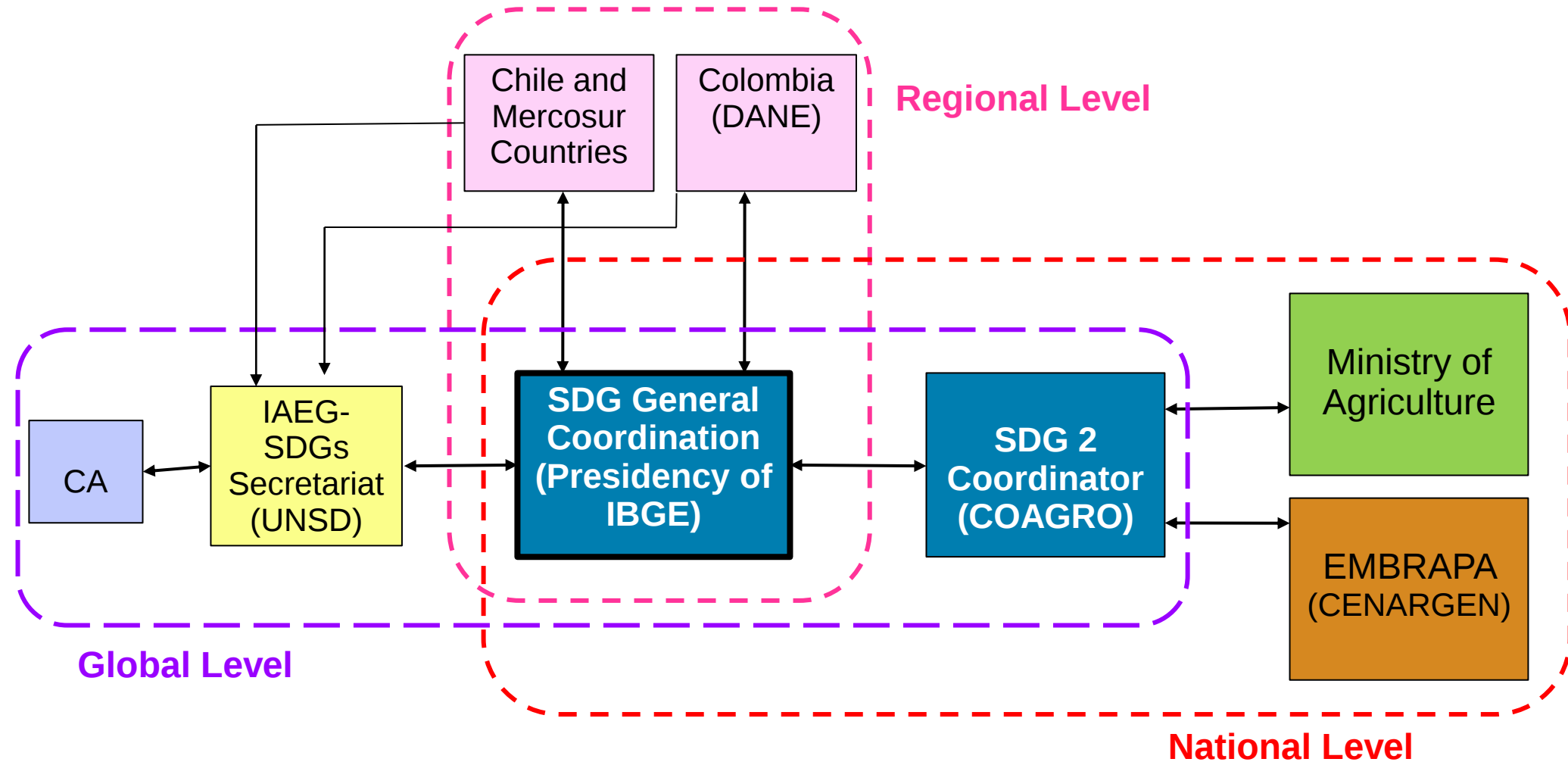

Open Call for Proposals

✓ 194 proposals received throughout this process

92 proposals met the criteria established by the IAEG-SDG.

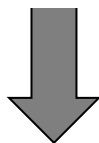
✓ Brazil sent comments on 66 proposed indicators (out of a total of 92)

We agreed with 34 proposals

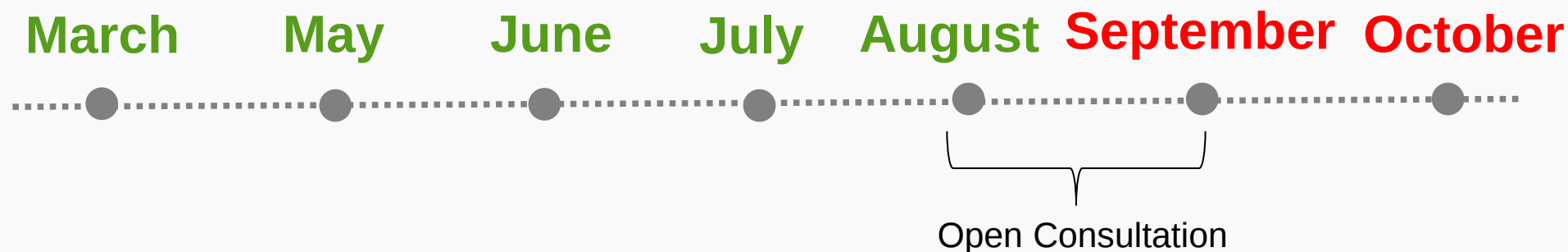
Color Coded Indicator Proposals

– a classification created by the Secretariat of IAEG-SDGs to analyse the contributions throughout the Open Call

33	Targets highlighted in this color are those the IAEG-SDG identified as possibly needing additional indicators
19	Indicators highlighted in this color are those that are Tier III and where methodological development has stalled and a replacement indicator is likely needed
1	Indicators highlighted in this color are Tier I and II indicators that currently lack data and where there are no plans for data collection activities to commence
71	Proposals highlighted in this color that meet all of the criteria established by the IAEG-SDG
74	Proposals highlighted in this color that do not meet the criteria established by the IAEG-SDG
49	Proposals highlighted in this color that are either comments that are not a specific proposal or proposals where it is not clear if all of the criteria have been met

- Importance of the participation of represented countries in IAEG-SDGs .
- Updated national focal points for SDG Indicators in the represented countries, and close collaboration with ECLAC.
- More time to conduct the next Comprehensive Review
- Templates for indicator proposals
- Planning consultations in a country level
