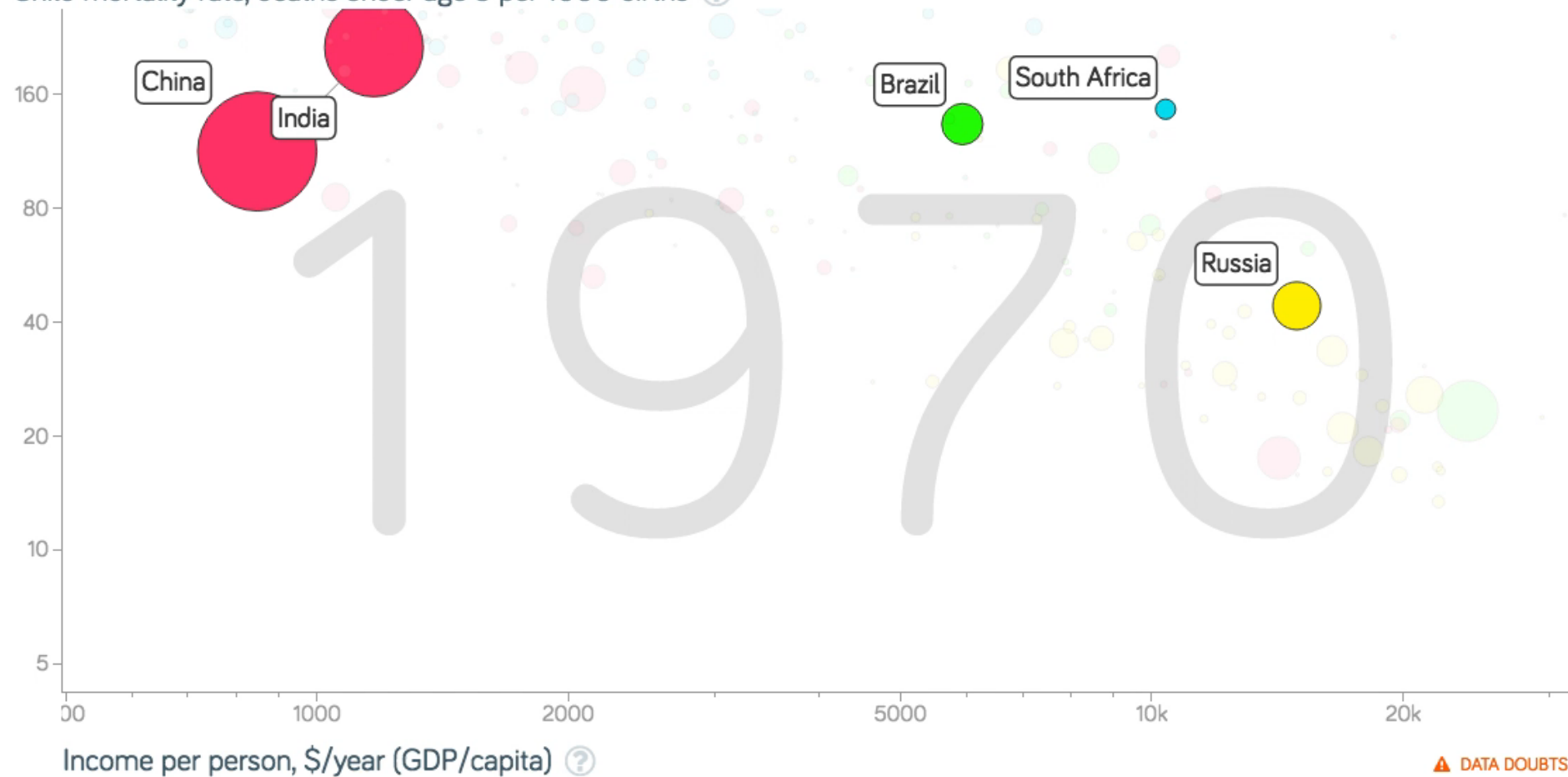


Child mortality rate

Deaths under age 5 per 1000 live births

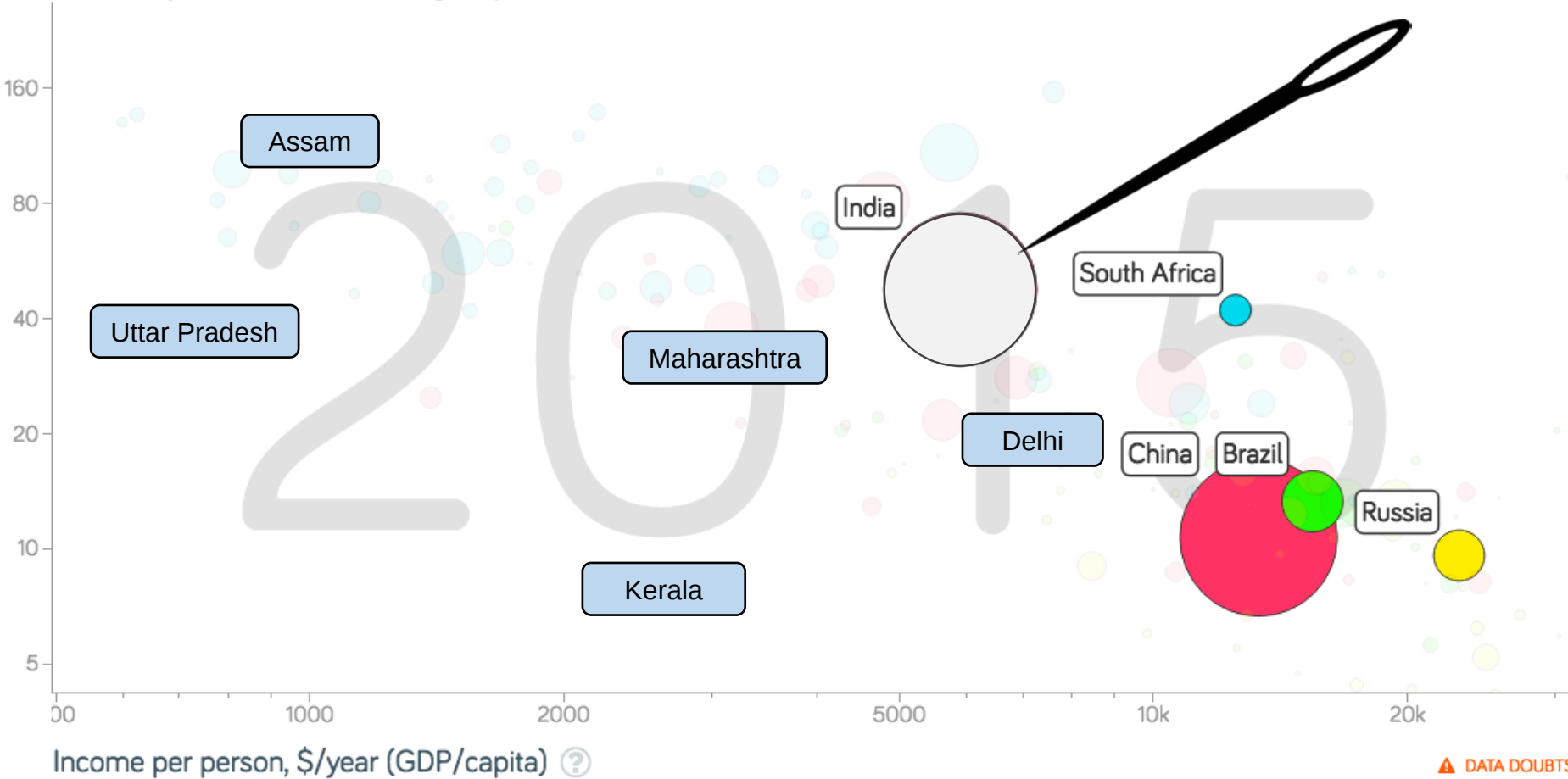

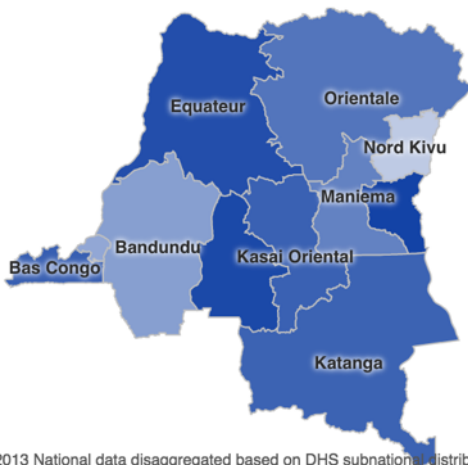
